There is a need to have an official dedicated to the implementation of tobacco control only reporting to the health promotion manager, as work load is likely to go up due to the Bill going to cabinet / parliament. The department will need salary funding for a year to year contract to have a dedicated official to tobacco control. Implementation of priority Article 6 and 15 that are lagging behind will be strengthened.
