2.8.4	<p>Please briefly describe the trends in taxation for tobacco products in the past three years or since submission of your last report in your jurisdiction.</p> <p>Over the past three years, the excise rate and excise-equivalent customs duty applied to tobacco have not changed other than by indexation (consumer price index) every six months occurring on 1 February and 1 August. The GST has also remained unchanged at a rate of 10 per cent.</p> <p>However, on 29 April 2010, the Treasurer announced a 25 per cent increase in the excise and excise-equivalent customs duty on tobacco products. An increase of 25 per cent is expected to reduce the number of daily smokers by approximately 3 per cent. For an estimated current daily smoking rate of 19 per cent amongst adults (over 18), a decline to approximately 18.4 per cent could be anticipated from this measure.</p>
