

14. The Convention also requires each party in accordance with its Constitution or Constitutional principles, to undertake a Comprehensive ban of all tobacco advertising, promotion and sponsorship.

15. For the purpose of tobacco control, the parties shall consider taking legislative action or promoting their existing laws, where necessary to deal with criminal and civil liabilities, including compensation where appropriate.

16. The Convention demands that each party shall promote and strengthen public awareness of tobacco control issues, using all available communication tools as appropriate. Towards the end of negotiations, each party shall adopt and implement effective legislative, executive, administrative or other measures.

17. The Convention will establish the Conference which shall oversee the effective implementation of the Convention.

18. The Honourable Ministers of Health and Social Welfare, Law and Constitutional Affairs, Finance and Information, Science and Technology have been consulted and they concurred.

19. Cabinet is invited to advise in accordance with paragraph 1 above.

RE: SMOKING BAN IN HEALTH FACILITIES

The Ministry of Health and Social Welfare has a National Public Health obligation of leading the citizens of Lesotho to the Smoke-free World. It is therefore mandated to lead by example. As health workers we are aware of the consequence of smoking to the smoker and non-smoker. So let's play a pivotal role in creating smoke-free environment for our workers, patients and visitors. Let all health institutions serve as a window of hope to the smoke-free Lesotho.

In an effort to practices what it preaches, the Ministry therefore declares:

- 1) All Ministry of Health and Social Welfare institutions as non-smoking areas.
- 2) Prohibits the sale of all tobacco products within the health premises and in the immediate surroundings.

- 3) All Ministry of Health and Social Welfare vehicles are declared smoke-free.

All managers of HSAs, Departments and Divisions are urged to ensure that this notice reaches all staff members in their sections. This is a serious and important move. All managers should closely monitor strict enforcement of this directive.

This directive takes effect from 1 January 2001.
