	No other National Health Survey has been done since the last report. Some data for some regions, but not representative for all the country, seems to show an increase in smoking in women, and a slow decrease in man. According to the Special Eurobarometer 385, the average number of cigarettes smoked daily is decreasing, from 15, 5 cigarettes/day in 2009 to 14,4 cigarettes/day in 2012.
