- (iii) In the "Security" pop up menu, please ensure that you have selected "Medium".
- 3. Close and re-open the WHO FCTC reporting instrument (Microsoft Word-based document which you saved to your computer under step 1).
- 4. As the document is opening, a box will appear asking if you want to enable macros. The answer is yes. Click "Enable macros".
- 5. Once you have clicked "Enable macros", the buttons indicating that you can add new rows or new categories to the tables provided will be functional.

- 1. When receiving the security warning "Some active content has been disabled", click "Enable content".
- 2. When receiving another security warning "Macros have been disabled", click "Enable content".

	While the prevalence of current smoking among adult population at 15-24 age group was 25,3% in 2008 it declined to 20,0% in 2012. The prevalence of adults at 25-44 age group declined from 39,9% to 35,7%, at 45-64 age group declined from 29,5% to 25,9% and at 65+ age group from 10,3% to 8,8%. The declining trend on smoking at all age group can be clearly observed as the positive outcomes of the comprehensive implementation of Smoke-free Law as well as other related FCTC requirements in Turkey

	Fewer non-smokers are being exposed to secondhand smoke at home and workplaces, after implementation of the national smoke-free law in 2009. Exposure to tobacco smoke in the workplace was 15,6% whose 17,8% was male and 9,6% was female. Exposure to tobacco smoke at home was 38,3% while 39,2% was male and 37,4% was female.

If the tax is expressed as a percentage (e.g. ad valorem tax), the base of the tax is the actual value of the good that is taxed; for example, 45% of the manufacturer's price, 30% of the retail price. In this case the "base" is the manufacturer's price or retail price. If the tax is expressed as an amount (e.g. specific tax), the base of the tax is the volume (number of pieces or by weight) of goods that is taxed. For example, if a tax is US\$ 5 per 100 cigarettes, the amount of tax is US\$ 5 and the base of the tax is 100 cigarettes.
